L.	To prepare for, conduct, and/or review negotiations or bargaining sessions with public employees concerning their compensation or other terms and conditions of their employment.
M.	To consider matters required to be kept confidential by federal law or regulations or state statutes.
N.	To discuss details relative to the security arrangements and emergency response protocols for the Board.
O.	To discuss confidential information related to an application for economic development assistance, or negotiations with other political subdivisions related to the application, as executive session is necessary to protect interests of the applicant or related expenditure of public funds. (Unanimous vote required.)

#### Item 2. Approval of resolution for a Change Order for the New Elementary Buildings

**WHEREAS**; the Fremont City Schools Board of Education (the Board) previously approved and entered into a CMR contract with Gilbane Building Company for the construction of the new elementary schools and,

**WHEREAS**; an alternate list was created during the GMP to add items at a later date as funding became available. Bid day savings has been returned to the project, and funding is now available to purchase classroom interactive boards and,

**WHEREAS**; the project team would like to accept a \$121,550.18 change order at each new elementary to add the interactive boards alternate to the project. For a total of \$486,200.72 at all four schools and,

**WHEREAS**; a board resolution is necessary to allow the superintendent to sign the change orders as they are over the superintendent's signature authority and,

**WHEREAS;** the change orders have been reviewed by the architect, Superintendent and Treasurer, and the OFCC Project Manager and,

**WHEREAS**; the Board wishes to approve and authorize execution of the change orders for classroom interactive boards at the new elementary schools in the total amount of \$486,200.72.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** the change orders adding interactive boards to the project in the total amount of \$486,200.72 are approved, subject to the approval of the OFCC. The Superintendent and Treasurer are authorized to sign the change orders.
