Lengthy Board discussion followed related to virtual learning versus in school learning and the District's modification of the Restart/Reopen Plan to be effective March 1, 2021.

Ms. Laird expressed her concerns about the independent learner model.

FISCAL

Report of the Treasurer

We are 7 months into the school year.

- Real Estate Taxes: January appears to be down significantly from last year. We received an advanced pay of \$771,000 last year. Currently, collections across the county are down approximately 10 percent. Spoke with County Auditor and it is difficult to say if that is due to slow pay or the slow USPS service. I anticipate that we will still come in close to budget.
- PUPP: I expect that we will be under budget for the year as Nexus has reduced their reportable values by approximately 12 to 13 percent. They are still tender paying at 47 percent.
- SDIT: We receive payments quarterly beginning with July and ending with an April payment. Should end the year very close to budget.
- Interest on Investments: This number is down due to the current low interest rate environment along with a continued decline in investable assets due to the District's deficit spending over the past several years.
