John Gordon, a distracted driving awareness advocate, presented his program to sophomores at Ross High School on May 2. Gordon knows the dangers of distracted driving, because on May 18, 2008, his son, John Travis "Rusty" Gordon, was killed when he was riding a motorcycle and a texting driver swerved into him in Marion County.

In 2015, 3,477 people were killed, and 391,000 were injured in motor vehicle crashes involving distracted drivers. Also 21 percent of teen drivers involved in fatal accidents were distracted by their cell phones.

The Fremont Exchange Club is considering partnering with Gordon to make this an annual program for the high school.
