Historical society unveils recent book

OAK HARBOR - Ottawa County Historical Society members and guests gathered at the Oak Harbor Golf Course on April 29 for their annual spring luncheon. President Pat O'Keeffe presented a program introducing the OCHS's latest publication, "Along the Highways and Waterways of Ottawa County".

The 225-page softcover book contains pictures and stories about many of the old structures, monuments, and landmarks that make up Ottawa County's manmade landscape. It features photographs and stories from all over the county, from 'haunted' houses to brick privies. The book was edited by Martha Dykes, with research and writing by Sandy Zenzer, Janet Stephenson, Peggy Debien, and Nancy Dunham of the OCHS's Oral History Committee.

The book is available for \$20 plus \$1.40 tax at the Ottawa County Museum, Oak Harbor Hardware, and Green's Drugs, and will be available at the Wolcott Keeper's House after its June 2 seasonal opening. The book may also be ordered from the OCHS website, ottawacountyhistory.org.
