FREMONT - Students fanned out across Fremont Ross High School's hallways Thursday, as student council members decked the halls with board game decorations for homecoming week.

Karrie Butler, a student council adviser, said this year's homecoming theme was "Board Games."

She said students pick a different theme every year for homecoming, with seniors electing to put Monopoly decorations up in their section of the school's hallways.

Butler said students had a lot of time to plan for Thursday's decorating, which started at 2:30 p.m. after classes ended for the day.

She said any student that wanted to participate was welcome to pitch in for homecoming decorations.

Student council president Hannah Kelly said between 20 and 30 seniors planned to help out on the decorations.

Kelly said students brought in dice, Monopoly money and other well-known features of the famous board game.

Fremont Ross' homecoming parade starts at 6 p.m. Friday, Butler said, with students gathering around 5:45 p.m. at the school.

The school's marching band will lead the parade, with student clubs from schools throughout the Fremont City School District participating.

The parade lasts until approximately 6:45 p.m., with Fremont Ross' football team playing at 7.

Butler said there will be a homecoming dance Saturday night at the high school.
