## Park district, Fremont schools receive awards

FREMONT - The Sandusky County Park District and Fremont City Schools were recently awarded the "Outstanding Interpretive Program" award from the Great Lakes Region of the National Association for Interpretation. The award was given in recognition of the Creek Bend Gifted Project.

The Gifted Project works with students in the third, fourth and fifth grades. The goal is to get the students out of the classroom and into the field to make observations and conduct actual experiments.

For the project, four visits to Creek Bend Farm are scheduled plus a final presentation day. The first visit entails an orientation to the property while the remainder of the visits include field work and hands-on data collection. Third graders conduct mammal studies, fourth graders conduct bird studies and fifth graders conduct a study of Muddy Creek.
