One is a sophomore. The punter rarely punted, and one blocked four punts.

He had 88 tackles and 12 tackles for loss in the regular season before Clyde advanced to Week 14. He broke up six passes and added 1.5 sacks.

He recovered a fumble as the Fliers eliminated top-seed Keystone in the regional quarterfinals.





Oak Harbor senior linebacker Clay Schulte

He had 133 tackles, 11 tackles for loss and seven sacks in the regular season as the Rockets took the SBC Bay Division crown outright. Oak Harbor allowed 21 combined points its first two postseason games.

Schulte was first-team all-league three times. He established numerous single-season and career records on both sides of the ball.

He'd be Messenger player of the year on either side.

He had 82 tackles, 17 tackles for loss and an interception in 10 games. The Redmen qualified to the postseason.

He had 13 tackles for loss and eight sacks to earn first-team status in the Three Rivers Athletic Conference and Northwest District. He had 24 solo tackles and 32 assists.

He blocked four punts and a field goal. He will continue his career at Bowling Green State University.

He had 13 tackles for loss and five sacks, with 20 solo tackles and 25 assists. He's also a lineman on the all-Messenger offense.

He had 46 tackles and seven sacks at nose guard as the Golden Bears were unbeaten in the regular season for a Sandusky Bay Conference River Division crown. At 5-foot-8, 171 pounds, he spent the offseason preparing to play defensive back.

He had 62 tackles, nine tackles for loss and six sacks in 10 victories in the regular season. He had 16 quarterback hurries.
