FREMONT – The Rutherford B. Hayes Presidential Library and Museums has invited the public to come to "Let's Celebrate Sandusky County's 200th Birthday."

This exhibit opening reception will be at Hayes at 2 p.m. Dec. 15, with remarks from the students at 2:15 p.m.

This exhibit will highlight the history of Sandusky County through the use of photos on two walls and will also use a timeline to share different historical points in history. Dozens of historic images artfully arranged in a photo collage tell the history of Sandusky County in visual form. This floor-to-ceiling mural will occupy two walls in the local history section of the Hayes Museum.

This project is a collaboration with Rutherford B. Hayes Presidential Library and Museums and a group of students from Heidelberg University in Tiffin. These students

are putting together this project for their final as a part of their public history course, taught by Christie Weininger, Hayes Presidential executive director.
