Union School, Croghan Street, late 1800s.

Here is a rare photo of the old Union School, probably taken before the turn of the 20th Century, looking east on Croghan across Park Avenue. The early Italianate brick structure was built in the late 1860s just after the Civil War, where it got its name, and Fremont's first high school classes were held there. It lasted until the original section of Ross High School was built along Croghan Street in 1909.
