## Board considers new fuel system

FREMONT -- The city's school district is looking to make some changes at the bus garage.

The district needs a fuel dispensing system and monitoring system said board member Linda Hershey, during Tuesday night's board of education meeting.

Each system will cost \$20,000 a piece.

There are three diesel tanks and one fuel tank that dispenses fuel at the garage.

"We don't have an accurate system to tell us what we dispense on a daily basis," Dr. Kimberly Theller, director of facilities and operations, said after the meeting.

She said a new system will give on a daily basis how much fuel is dispensed, which will be sent to a petroleum board. This will basically ensure that fuels are not being leaked into the environment.

In other news, the district will hold off on re-paving the Ross High School parking lot until after the new middle school is built.

At the next meeting, at 6 p.m. Feb. 2, there will be an update on the Fremont Middle School project.
