FREMONT --Students from the Fremont City Schools gifted program will be presenting projects from their independent study research projects at the first "Research Revelations" on Monday.

The projects will be on display from 5 to 6 p.m. at the Vanguard Tech Center student lounge prior to the Fremont Board of Education meeting.

The gifted students in grades four, five and six from all seven of the Fremont Elementary Schools began working on their research projects in January within the areas of the identification. Students selected topics, and then went through the research process with their gifted intervention teachers. During the research portion, students were also able to work with librarians at Birchard Public Library. After completing the research process, students then constructed a tri-fold board presentation, which they will have on display for public viewing on Monday.
