LEVY

On Election Day, Nov. 3, there will be a 5-year renewal of the existing property tax levy on the ballot for Lindsey residents. According to Lindsey Village Mayor R.F. Opelt, the levy, at a rate not to exceed 4 mills, is targeted to raise a specific amount and will not result in revenue increase for the village, regardless of property valuations.

The Village of Lindsey, according to Mayor Opelt, has not increased property taxes since 2000, and he said "this renewal will continue that trend and is intended to provide for the continued operation of the Village."
