
As we enter into the new school year, there remains uncertainties with the Delta variant of the COVID-19 virus. Ross High School and the district are committed to providing your student with a safe environment to get their education. We will retain some of our practices from last year in order to better protect your child from exposure to germs. Our custodial staff will continue to disinfect classroom and hallway surfaces frequently. We will also continue our practice of not issuing lockers and having students carry their belongings to class. This helps expedite the transition from one period to the next, limiting student exposure to congested areas. Families are reminded that students who present with symptoms of being sick will be sent home for the safety of those around them. If your child has a fever, please keep them home until they are fever free.

The daily schedule has been altered to have a 10 period day, instead of a 12 period day. This will allow our classes to be 52 minutes for each course. This will allow our students more time for a deeper exploration of the concepts being addressed in class. It is important that all families understand that the change in the master schedule will reduce our lunches from four different periods to three. This will increase the number of students per lunch period. An alternative lunch space will be provided for students should seating in the cafeteria become limited. This is an inconvenience, but it will be short-lived. Upon our transition to the new building, plenty of space and seating will be available for our students.

All students at Ross High School will be issued a Chromebook as we embrace moving into a 1:1 technology initiative. Information regarding laptop rollout will be found in this newsletter. Freshman will receive their computers on their first day of school, August 30. It is critical that students bring a charged laptop to school on a daily basis. Many of their textbooks will be online and each teacher will have a Google classroom created for their subject. All Ross families are encouraged to check their email daily for important school information.

We have a number of staff changes to announce for the upcoming year. Michelle Lajti has joined the Ross staff from Fremont Middle School to teach Physics and Chemistry. Joining Michelle in coming from FMS is Samuel Berlekamp who will be a band instructor at Ross. We welcome Alexis Gedeon home to teach Government and Economics after teaching social studies at Fostoria HS. A Ross grad, Alexis is excited to return and give back to the students at Ross. Jen Long comes to Ross after teaching in Tiffin. Mrs. Long will be teaching Social Studies and Computer Science at Ross. Ms. Sherri Henkel joins the Ross staff after being on assignment in the district office. Ms. Henkel will be teaching Geometry and Algebra I.

This year will present a new beginning for Ross High School and our community as we move to the new building. This will cause challenges but the faculty, staff, and administration at Ross stand ready to meet these challenges head on. We look forward to an exciting year of challenging your student and helping them meet their educational goals.

Remember, to receive a waiver, you must have two seasons of sports participation even if you have taken one semester of Physical Education. There are no partial waivers.

<u>1:1 COMPUTER INITIATIVE</u>

Ross High School is excited to announce that we will undertake a 1:1 computer initiative for the 2021-2022 school year. All students attending classes at Ross will be issued a Chromebook and carrying case to aid in their academic pursuits. The following will detail the schedule and procedure laptop distribution:

All on-campus, 9th grade students will receive their device on the first day of school- August 30, 2021

Distribution Procedure

Upon entering through the main doors at Ross:

- Check in at the FinalForms table to verify your forms have been completed and submitted. A staff member will be at a labeled table in the main hallway. <u>No device will be issued without FinalForms being completed and</u> <u>submitted by both the parent and the student.</u> A limited number of devices will be set up to allow families the opportunity to complete their FinalForms on site. It is strongly recommended you do this before the distribution dates in order to expedite the process.
- 2. After verifying FinalForms are complete, proceed to the Ross library, entering the first set of doors. Enter into the appropriate alphabetical line. A-J, K-R, S-Z. At this time you will receive your district-issued carrying case and identification card. Place the ID card where instructed.
- 3. Move to the next queue and wait for a representative to call you forward. The computer will be scanned into the system and your device will be placed in the protective case. Please note All students must use the district provided case. Students are not permitted to purchase their own case and use that instead.
- 4. Students will then step to the last station where they will log into their device and long into ProgressBook. This is where they will get their schedule for the year. No paper schedules will be issued. This step in the process will also allow us to verify that each device is operational prior to exiting the building.

Important Information

- 1. All students will be charged \$20 for their device. This amount will be placed on student fees and must be paid. This feel does not qualify for fee waivers. Families who would like to pay their fee at the time of distribution should stop at the finance office after receiving their device.
- 2. Students are responsible for transporting their charged device to and from school on a daily basis.
- 3. All acceptable use policies, as established by Fremont City Schools, apply.
- 4. Students who willfully damage a device will be charged the full amount of the repair.
- 5. All devices have one accidental damage waiver. This means should an accident occur, the device can be submitted for repair for no cost to families. This is permitted ONE TIME PER CALENDAR YEAR

Immunization Requirement for 12th Grade

The Ohio Department of Health is requiring all students entering 12th grade be vaccinated against meningococcal disease. The students are required to have the MCV4 immunization prior to the first day of 12th grade. Please contact the Sandusky County Health Department at (419)334-6367 or your family physician to schedule an appointment. Students not in compliance with the immunization requirements are to be excluded from school attendance no later than the 15th day after the start of school.

Please provide documentation to the school nurse or Ross main office as soon as possible after your student receives the required immunization.

CALCULATOR POLICY - ROSS HIGH SCHOOL

Due to the mandated Ohio state testing, it is necessary that all students have the appropriate calculator for the course they are enrolled.

Students enrolling in Algebra II, Statistics, Trigonometry, Pre-Calculus, and AP Calculus are required to purchase a TI 83, TI 83 Plus, TI 84, or TI 84 Plus graphing calculator. This will be the only calculator most students will need through their high school and college career. Calculators may be purchased at many stores around Fremont. The Math Department encourages parents to have their student pay for all or part of their own calculator.

Students enrolled in Algebra II or higher may be loaned one for the year. A Calculator Loan Contract requiring the student and a parent signature needs to be filled out and returned to the math teacher. That teacher turns the contract over to the office for verification of qualification and an administrator's signature. The student will then be given a TI 83 Plus calculator to use for the year. After the final exam, the student must return the calculator to the math teacher. If it is not returned, the cost of the calculator is added to school fees.

Students enrolling in Algebra I or Geometry are encouraged, but not required, to purchase a TI 83, TI 83 Plus, TI 84, or TI 84 Plus graphing calculator to become more familiar with its functions and use. Students enrolled in these course are required to have a TI 30 calculator for basic computations.

All students may receive a free breakfast and lunch throughout the 2021-2022 school year. In order to receive the meals for free, students must take all components required by USDA. A la carte items may be purchased separately. Parents are still encouraged to apply on-line for free/reduced lunches at <u>www.lunchapp.com</u> for the 2021-2022 school year, as meal status may be used to determine eligibility for other benefits such as fee waivers. No cash will be accepted in the school cafeterias, but you may make payments via cash, check or credit/debit card (by phone or in person) at the Ross Finance office or pay in advance online at <u>www.sendmoneytoschool.com</u>.

Students with documented food allergies or meal needs are required to have a physician's note on file with the school in order for accommodations to be arranged. If you have any questions regarding school meals please forward them to <u>ruscht@fremontschools.net</u>.

ACE MENTORING

ACE (Assisting Children to Excel) Mentoring Program is a school based mentoring program at Ross High School for students in grades 9–12 and at Fremont Middle School for grades 6-8 that provides career guidance and supportive services to participating students. Students and mentors are matched based on their career or similar interests. Our community mentors represent many careers and backgrounds and meet with their students at Ross High School and Fremont Middle School weekly during the school day virtually this year.

Parent permission is required for a student to participate in ACE and to have a mentor. All mentors are required to complete an application and pass an FBI and BCI background check.

Research shows that mentoring relationships help students acquire additional confidence, learn new skills, and increase their grades and attendance. ACE Mentoring Program within Fremont City Schools has been successful in meeting these goals.

Funding for ACE Mentoring Program is provided by the United Way of Sandusky County and there is no cost for students to participate.
