## Atkinson Gifted Students Investigating Ecology and the Scientific Method

The Atkinson Third and Fourth Grade Gifted and Talented Program students have begun working on their science based project. This year, we will be working with the staff at Creek Bend Farms. The third graders have begun to collect data on the small mammal population, and the fourth graders are banding birds and entering the data into the National Aviary Database.

During this year-long project, the students will be developing an understanding, and following the steps of the Scientific Method. They have already formed a hypothesis and have begun collecting data and have found their dependent and independent variables. It is an exciting project, and the students can't wait until May to see their final results.
