Dear Fremont Ross Families and Students,

As we have now moved into the second semester of the school year, it is expected that Fremont Ross will continue to grow from what we have learned in the first semester, and strive to be better as a student body with improved school pride.

Please make sure you talk to your senior about this information. It is critical that deadlines are met in order to facilitate a smooth graduation process. All seniors must have a signed graduation contract on file with the Main Office in order to participate in the commencement ceremony. Diploma order forms are also due.

Finally, each day provides an opportunity for every student to improve and make themselves better. Our Fremont Ross community is growing strong, and we appreciate the enthusiasm and support from our students, staff and community.

MANDATORY STATE TESTING UPCOMING

MANDATORY ACT TEST FOR ALL JUNIORS – FEBRUARY 27, 2024

MANDATORY ACT TESTING FOR ALL JUNIORS - FEBRUARY 27, 2024. On Tuesday, February 27, 2024, the state-funded ACT testing will take place at Ross for students in the Junior class. This opportunity allows all juniors to take the ACT free of charge.

The school day will remain a day of instruction for all students. We will run a 3-hour Early Release schedule which will allow instruction for all students, then provide juniors the time and opportunity to complete the ACT test. Freshmen, sophomores, and seniors will be allowed to leave the school at 11:30 am, while juniors will stay to complete the ACT test. Those juniors who are not interested in taking the ACT, may opt out of the testing by emailing Mrs. Oravets at oravetsc@fremontschools.net.

Before the exam ...

On a date before the testing, all Juniors must complete the ACT Prep for Testing forms. Students attending Ross will complete this in their English/Language Arts 11 class. If you are a Junior at Vanguard, Ross administration will come to Vanguard and you will complete the forms at Vanguard. If you are a CCP student, (without an ELA 11 class at Ross) you will need to come to Ross to complete these forms. These forms must be completed prior to taking the ACT. It usually takes each student 60-75 minutes to complete! CCP students, watch your school email for the dates to come to Ross to complete these forms!

Grow Your Own Teacher Scholarship for Seniors

The Grow Your Own Teacher Scholarship Program is designed to help school districts across Ohio recruit their own students and staff to become teachers within the district. Recipients of the Grow Your Own Scholarship agree to teach for a minimum of four years at their home school district in exchange for a scholarship of up to \$7,500/year for four years.

Application periods will be set by the Ohio Department of Higher Education as funding is available. Leadership staff at <u>qualifying schools</u> are expected to pro-actively recruit their own students and employees to participate in this program. Each school district interested in participating in the Ohio GYO Teacher Scholarship Program must attest that it has difficulty recruiting and retaining qualified classroom teachers.

The scholarship application will be open to the following:

- Individuals employed at a qualifying school who hold an educational aide permit, educational paraprofessional license, or substitute license (this includes educational service center employees who are assigned to the qualifying school); and
- Low-income high school seniors attending a qualifying school.

As part of the application, the district in which GYO Scholarship applicants are employed or enrolled must attest to an intent to hire the GYO Scholarship recipient as a teacher after his or her graduation and licensure.

Ohio's Grow Your Own Teacher Scholarship Program is authorized by Ohio Revised Code sections 3333.393 and 3333.394.

ATTENTION Families of Class of 2025 - Immunization Requirement for 12th Grade



The Ohio Department of Health is requiring all students entering 12th grade to be vaccinated against meningococcal disease. The students are required to have the MCV4 immunization prior to the first day of 12th grade.

Please contact the Sandusky County Health Department at 419.334.6367 or your family physician to schedule an appointment. Consider making your child's appointment soon because summer appointments are in demand and sometimes unavailable. According to the Ohio Revised Code, students not in compliance with the immunization requirements are to be excluded from school attendance no later than the 15th day after the start of school.

Please provide documentation to the school nurse as soon as possible after your child receives the required immunization.

ABSENCES, TRUANCIES, and OFF SCHEDULE

We firmly believe that your child's attendance and proper behavior is critical to their classroom success and their graduation pathway. Resources are available at Fremont Ross to support your child in most situations. Please encourage your child to reach out to their grade level counselor fo learn about these resources.

Students marked as excessively absent, truant, or off-schedule will be scheduled for intervention meetings with Mr. Jason Smith, our Attendance Coordinator and the grade level principal and counselor to create a plan that will assist your child in their school attendance.

Excessive absences, truancies, and off-schedules will impact a students ability to attend the Fremont Ross Prom on Saturday, May 4, 2024. Students who have accumulated six (6) or more unexcused absences, three (3) truancy/off-schedule incidents or seven (7) or more tardiness violations during the time period between the start of the second semester and the Thursday before prom tickets go on sale, will be excluded from attending the prom.

Students who have violated the student code of conduct, resulting in out of school suspension days in excess of three (3), are ineligible to participate in prom.

Morning Drop off Between FMS and Fremont Ross

We have cars in the morning dropping off students behind FMS. Some Ross students drop off siblings behind FMS, and then drive through the bus loop to the Ross parking lot. While this practice is time saving for our student drivers, it is a safety hazard for cars, buses, and students crossing between buses. All FMS students must be dropped off in the front of FMS, or the FMS students allow the Ross student to park and walk over to FMS. Please encourage your students to follow this routine so we can keep everyone safe during morning drop-off at both schools.



- Wednesdays: Snack / Board/Card Games


- Thursdays: Hot Meal / Coloring

A delicious recipe from Mrs. Gera Durbin

Roasted Winter Vegetables with Balsamic Vinegar

Prep Time: 20 minutes mins Cook Timez: 20 minutes mins

Ingredients:

2 medium carrots chopped into 3/4-1 inch pieces

2 medium sweet potatoes diced into 3/4-1 inch pieces

2 small potatoes cut into 1-inch

2 celery ribs chopped into 3/4 inch

2 medium parsnips chopped into 3/4-1 inch pieces

1 large red pepper quartered into 3/4-1 inch

1 medium red onion quartered into 3/4-1 inch

1/4 cup olive oil 60 ml

1 teaspoon paprika

1 teaspoon dried rosemary

1 teaspoon salt or to taste

1/2 teaspoon black pepper

3/4 teaspoon garlic powder

1/4 cup balsamic vinegar 60 ml, or use a tablespoon less if you don't prefer strong flavors of balsamic vinegar 1/3 cup chopped Italian parsley

Instructions:

- 1. Start by peeling and chopping all the veggies. I chopped all of them into 3/4 to 1 inch pieces. The onions and peppers were quartered.
- 2. Transfer chopped veggies to a bowl and add olive to it. Stir to combine. Then add the paprika, rosemary, salt, pepper.
- 3. Toss everything together.
- 4. Transfer to a sheet pan. Bake at 400 F (pre-heated oven) for 18-20 minutes or until veggies are done yet firm.
- 5. Once veggies are roasted, transfer them to a bowl again (easier to mix in a bowl) and add garlic powder, balsamic vinegar and mix everything together. I would suggest reserving 1 tablespoon of the vinegar, taste test and only then add more. I did add all the 1/4 cup as per my taste.
- 6. Add in freshly chopped parsley and toss to combine.
- 7. Serve roasted winter vegetables as a side with a warm soup!


Notes:

Other veggies that you can use- cauliflower, broccoli, brussel sprouts. You need a total of 6 to 7 cups of chopped vegetables so you can mix things up.
