Charity game raises money to help children with cancer

FREMONT -- The varsity, junior varsity and freshman volleyball teams of Fremont Ross took on their rivals from Sandusky on Saturday in the annual "Hitting to Heal" Kids Helping Kids charity volleyball game. All proceeds went to Alexa's Butterflies of Hope the Alexa Brown Foundation.

All the money raised stays in the area and helps with the costs incurred by the families of the children who are affected by the Eastern Sandusky County Cancer Cluster.
