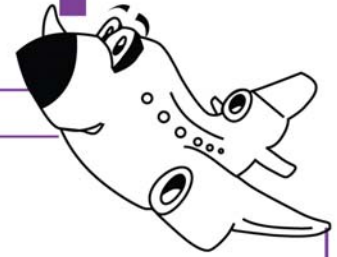

Ten Tips for Parents of School Age Children

Tip#2

Create a print rich home environment.

Include both books (and books on tape) and writing materials. Include newspapers and child-oriented versions of popular magazines (e.g., Time for Kids, National Geographic for Kids). Set aside a special reading area in your home and make sure everyone uses it.

Make a list of all of the things you (parent/caregiver) read in a day and share it with your child. Include everything... recipes, street signs, etc.

Read aloud with and to your child everyday.
