**OCIS Scholarship Search**—The Ohio Career Information System (OCIS) has an extensive scholarship listing and/or search program available to Ross students. Go to <http://ocis.ode.state.oh.us> User name: FremontRoss password: ohiocis03 Click on Financial Aid in column on left. There are many categories to choose from based on your personal characteristics, activities, etc. There is also a scholarship search on the left that allows you to narrow down the possibilities by entering your personal information. This is an excellent resource for students seeking scholarship opportunities.

**Latino Scholarships**—*Latino College Dollars: Scholarships for America’s Latino Students* has a web site [www.latinocollegedollars.org](http://www.latinocollegedollars.org), which allows students and families to search for scholarships by type and documentation status without registering or paying a fee.

**Hispanic Scholarship Fund Scholarships**—Available to Hispanic graduating high school seniors who plan to enroll in a two or four year college. Minimum 3.0 GPA. Must be US citizen or permanent resident. Must apply for federal student aid also. [www.hsf.net](http://www.hsf.net) This website is an excellent resource for Hispanic students.

**Marquette University College of Nursing**—Florence Brady Murray Memorial Scholarship. For nursing students of need at Marquette University. Applicants must be from one of 4 cities—Clyde, Oak Harbor, Sandusky, Fremont—or be born in Ireland.

**Oh the Places You’ll Go College Scholarship Program**—Open to graduating seniors. Essay required (one page) based on the Dr. Seuss book. I have a handout in my office. **February 15, 2010.**

**National Co-op Scholarship Program**—GPA of 3.5 or better. Must be accepted at one or more of the ten National Co-op Partner Colleges. These colleges include the University of Toledo and the University of Cincinnati. [www.co-op.edu](http://www.co-op.edu) **February 15, 2010.**

**The Ayn Rand Institute 21<sup>st</sup> Annual Essay Contest on Ayn Rand’s Novel *The Fountainhead***—800 to 1,600 words. Top Prize--\$10,000. **April 26, 2010.**

**Hiram College Scholarships**—Dean’s--\$15,000 per year, 3.7 GPA/26ACT; Heritage--\$12,000 per year, 3.4 GPA/22ACT; Hiram--\$10,000 per year, 3.0 GPA/20ACT. Automatic upon admission to Hiram. **Apply to Hiram for consideration.**

**US Bank Internet Scholarship Program**—No minimum GPA. Apply online at [usbank.com/studentloans](http://usbank.com/studentloans) Not obligated to be a customer of US Bank. **February 28, 2010.**

**KFC Colonel's Scholars Program**—Up to \$5,000 per year. Must be a graduating senior, US citizen or permanent resident, GPA of 2.75 or higher, plan to attend a 2 or 4 year public, in-state college or university, pursuing a bachelor's degree. [www.kfcscholars.org](http://www.kfcscholars.org) Apply online from **December 1 until February 10, 2010.**

**Ferris State University Great Lakes Scholarship**—Open to new Ferris State freshmen who live in one of several states including Ohio. It allows eligible students to pay in-state tuition for up to 15 credit hours a semester. [scholarships@ferris.edu](mailto:scholarships@ferris.edu)

**Ferris State University Woodbridge N. Ferris Scholarships**—Freshman scholarships based on high school GPA and ACT. Must be a full-time Ferris State student. Range from full tuition to \$2000/year. Also many other scholarships in many majors available. See Mrs. Kelly for information.

**Bowling Green State University Delbert Latta Scholarship**— \$2000 Bowling Green scholarships to Northwest Ohio students who are law-abiding with a minimum GPA of 3.0.

**Fremont Ross High School Sports Hall of Fame Scholarship**—Awarded to one Ross High School senior boy and one Ross High School senior girl who have received at least one varsity letter and will be attending college in the fall. \$1000.00. **March 26, 2010.**

**Northwest Ohio Chapter of Credit Unions Scholarship Award**—To qualify, students must plan to participate in post high school studies including vocational, professional, and academic studies (not limited to colleges and universities.) Essay or video required. **February 12, 2010.**

**AXA Achievement Community Scholarship**—AXA Achievers share these characteristics: Ambition and drive, determination to set and reach goals, respect for self, family, and community, ability to succeed in college.

**The William D. Squires Educational Foundation Scholarship**—This scholarship is for **OHIO** high school students, but you need not attend college in Ohio. Scholarships based primarily on financial need (EFC \$7,999 or less.) Any major, but must have a specific career goal, good character, be highly motivated, and show academic promise. 3.2 GPA is required. A minimum of 12 \$3000 scholarships to be awarded. Renewable for 3 years. This has been won by a Ross student in the past! Application at [www.wmdsquiresfoundation.org](http://www.wmdsquiresfoundation.org) **April 5, 2010.**

**Sandusky County Voiture 1057 Forty & Eight (40 et 8) Nurses' Training Scholarship**—For high school seniors of Sandusky and Seneca Counties planning to attend an accredited nursing program as a first year student. This scholarship is for future nurses only. **April 7, 2010.**

**Sandusky County Safety Council Scholarship**—Applicants must be family members (children, stepchildren, or grandchildren) of Sandusky County Safety Council member companies. (I have a list of companies; there are many!) Must be a US citizen, be a full-time high school senior, and demonstrate an interest in pursuing a career in the field of Occupational Safety and Health, Industrial Hygiene, Environmental Science, Risk Management, Civil and Emergency Services (Police, Fire, EMT), Occupational Rehabilitation, or a related field. 3.0 or above GPA and recommendation from high school. **March 31, 2010.**

**Best Buy @15 Scholarship Program** -- Looking for students with solid grades, who are involved in volunteer efforts in their schools and communities, and/or have a work history. Students must be planning to attend a college, university or technical school in the fall immediately following their high school graduation. 9–12th grade students from private, public, alternative or home schools are eligible to apply.. **The James Kura Memorial Scholarship of the Ohio Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers**—Any major is eligible. 2.5 GPA, plan to attend an accredited 4-year college or university beginning in 2009. Essay required. Mrs. Kelly has applications. **February 19, 2010.**

**Bowling Green State University Tuition Scholarship for Underrepresented Students--Minority** scholarship. Up to full tuition awarded. Download application at <http://choose.bgsu.edu/aid/tuition> or see Mrs. Kelly for paper application. Priority deadline is **March 1, 2010.**

**Ohio Association of Career Colleges and Schools**—Full and half-tuition scholarships. C or better average. Do not have to demonstrate financial need. These scholarships are for very specific trade and vocational schools such as Akron Machining Institute, ITT Technical Institute, Ohio Business College, Ohio Institute of Photography, Brown Mackie, Davis College in Toledo, RETS Technical Center, Stautzenberger College, more. See Mrs. Kelly for list of participating schools. These scholarships **do not** include academic four year colleges and universities. **April 1, 2010.**

**Jamie Farr Scholarship of the Toledo Community Foundation**—High school seniors from Northwest Ohio/Southeast Michigan area who will be attending an accredited school of higher education in the fall of 2010. Renewable. Criteria: annual parental/guardian gross income of \$55,000 or less, ACT 24/SAT 1100 or higher, prior academic achievement, individual motivation, ability, and potential, recommendations. **March 5, 2010.**

**Bowling Green State University Alumni Freshman Biology Scholarship**—For freshmen majoring in biology at BGSU. Based on GPA, standardized test scores, school and community activities, letters of recommendation. **February 12, 2010.**

**Old Fort Banking Company Scholarships for Tiffin University, Heidelberg College, The University of Findlay and Terra Community College**—Must be a graduating senior who will be attending one of these four colleges in the fall. Educational goals directed toward the betterment of the community. Judged on the essay portion of the application. **April 9, 2010.**

**OAPSE/AFSCME Memorial Scholarship Foundation Program**—Any graduating high school senior whose parent/ legal guardian is member in good standing of the Ohio Association of Public School Employees (OAPSE/AFSCME Local 4/ AFL-CIO) and who intends to enroll in a full-time degree program in any accredited two year or four year college, university, business, or technical school. The scholarship may be used for any field of study. This scholarship does not include teachers' children. **March 1, 2010.**

**Fremont Federal Credit Union Scholarship—LOCAL**—Applicants or parents/guardians must be a member in good standing of the Fremont Federal Credit Union as of January 1, 2009. Based on GPA (2.5 minimum), school involvement, community involvement, essay question. **March 22, 2010.**
