OCIS Scholarship Search—The Ohio Career Information System (OCIS) has an extensive scholarship listing and/or search program available to Ross students. Go to <http://ocis.ode.state.oh.us> User name: FremontRoss password: ohiocis03 Click on Financial Aid in column on left. There are many categories to choose from based on your personal characteristics, activities, etc. There is also a scholarship search on the left that allows you to narrow down the possibilities by entering your personal information. This is an excellent resource for students seeking scholarship opportunities.

Latino Scholarships—*Latino College Dollars: Scholarships for America's Latino Students* has a web site www.latinocollegedollars.org, which allows students and families to search for scholarships by type and documentation status without registering or paying a fee.

Hispanic Scholarship Fund Scholarships—Available to Hispanic graduating high school seniors who plan to enroll in a two or four year college. Minimum 3.0 GPA. Must be US citizen or permanent resident. Must apply for federal student aid also. www.hsf.net This website is an excellent resource for Hispanic students.

Ferris State University Great Lakes Scholarship—Open to new Ferris State freshmen who live in one of several states including Ohio. It allows eligible students to pay in-state tuition for up to 15 credit hours a semester. scholarships@ferris.edu

Ferris State University Woodbridge N. Ferris Scholarships—Freshman scholarships based on high school GPA and ACT. Must be a full-time Ferris State student. Range from full tuition to \$2000/year. Also many other scholarships in many majors available. See Mrs. Kelly for information.

Fremont Ross High School Sports Hall of Fame Scholarship—Awarded to one Ross High School senior boy and one Ross High School senior girl who have received at least one varsity letter and will be attending college in the fall. \$1000.00. **March 26, 2010.**

The William D. Squires Educational Foundation Scholarship—This scholarship is for **OHIO** high school students, but you need not attend college in Ohio. Scholarships based primarily on financial need (EFC \$7,999 or less.) Any major, but must have a specific career goal, good character, be highly motivated, and show academic promise. 3.2 GPA is required. A minimum of 12 \$3000 scholarships to be awarded. Sandusky County Voiture 1057 Forty & Eight (40 et 8) Nurses' Training Scholarship—For high school seniors of Sandusky and Seneca Counties planning to attend an accredited nursing program as a first year student. This scholarship is for future nurses only. **April 7, 2010.**

Sandusky County Safety Council Scholarship—Applicants must be family members (children, stepchildren, or grandchildren) of Sandusky County Safety Council member companies. (I have a list of companies; there are many!) Must be a US citizen, be a full-time high school senior, and demonstrate an interest in pursuing a career in the field of Occupational Safety and Health, Industrial Hygiene, Environmental Science, Risk Management, Civil and Emergency Services (Police, Fire, EMT), Occupational Rehabilitation, or a related field. 3.0 or above GPA and recommendation from high school. **March 31, 2010.**

Bowling Green State University Tuition Scholarship for Underrepresented Students--Minority scholarship. Up to full tuition awarded. Download application at <http://choose.bgsu.edu/aid/tuition> or see Mrs. Kelly for paper application. Priority deadline is **March 1, 2010.**

Ohio Association of Career Colleges and Schools—Full and half-tuition scholarships. C or better average. Do not have to demonstrate financial need. These scholarships are for very specific trade and vocational schools such as Akron Machining Institute, ITT Technical Institute, Ohio Business College, Ohio Institute of Photography, Brown Mackie, Davis College in Toledo, RETS Technical Center, Stautzenberger College, more. See Mrs. Kelly for list of participating schools. These scholarships **do not** include academic four year colleges and universities. **April 1, 2010.**

Jamie Farr Scholarship of the Toledo Community Foundation—High school seniors from Northwest Ohio/Southeast Michigan area who will be attending an accredited school of higher education in the fall of 2010. Renewable. Criteria: annual parental/guardian gross income of \$55,000 or less, ACT 24/SAT 1100 or higher, prior academic achievement, individual motivation, ability, and potential, recommendations.

Old Fort Banking Company Scholarships for Tiffin University, Heidelberg College, The University of Findlay and Terra Community College—Must be a graduating senior who will be attending one of these four colleges in the fall. Educational goals directed toward the betterment of the community. Judged on the essay portion of the application. **April 9, 2010.**

OAPSE/AFSCME Memorial Scholarship Foundation Program—Any graduating high school senior whose parent/ legal guardian is member in good standing of the Ohio Association of Public School Employees (OAPSE/AFSCME Local 4/ AFL-CIO) and who intends to enroll in a full-time degree program in any accredited two year or four year college, university, business, or technical school. The scholarship may be used for any field of study. This scholarship does not include teachers' children. **March 1, 2010.**

Fremont Federal Credit Union Scholarship—**LOCAL**—Applicants or parents/guardians must be a member in good standing of the Fremont Federal Credit Union as of January 1, 2009. Based on GPA (2.5 minimum), school involvement, community involvement, essay question. **March 22, 2010.**

Clyde Findlay Area Credit Union—Must be graduating from a high school in Sandusky, Hancock, or Seneca County, be continuing education in the fall at an accredited college, university, or trade school and be a member of the Clyde-Findlay Area Credit Union to be eligible. **March 26, 2010**

Scholar Athlete Milk Mustache of the Year (SAMMY) Award—Recognizes outstanding scholar athletes in grade 12 who show excellence in academics(35%), athletic performance (35%), leadership(15%), community service(10%), and milk experience(5%). \$7500.00 scholarship. SAMMY 2010 applications accepted only online at bodybymilk.com until **March 5, 2010.**

Ohio Newspapers Foundation Minority Scholarship—African American, Hispanic, Asian American, or American Indian student planning to pursue a newspaper journalism career. Attending Ohio college or university next year. 2.5 GPA. 750 to 1000 word autobiography required. **March 31, 2010.**

Printing Industries Education Funds Scholarship—To provide assistance to promising students interested in a career in the graphic communications industry. Recipients must be planning to study in an accredited graphic communications program preferably in the state of **Ohio** or northern Kentucky. Minimum 2.5 GPA. Students in graphics programs at Terra and BGSU are eligible for this award. Application materials at www.pianko.org **February 28, 2010.**
