- M. To consider matters required to be kept confidential by federal law or regulations or state statutes.
- N. To discuss details relative to the security arrangements and emergency response protocols for the Board.
- O. To discuss confidential information related to an application for economic development assistance, or negotiations with other political subdivisions related to the application, as executive session is necessary to protect interests of the applicant or related expenditure of public funds. (Unanimous vote required.)

•Lindsay Weickert, who lives at 1974 County Road 135, Lindsey asked to speak about the Volleyball Program. Lindsay was captain of the 2017 Varsity Volleyball Team and was there to represent the members of the Varsity Team and to express their support for their coach, and for each other. They believe they have been unfairly criticized in the public and on social media. She spoke of positive things that happened with their team this year and presented a letter to the Members of the Board that was signed by the Players and Parents to offer an overview of the program from their perspective. The expectations and rules were set forth at the beginning of the season by their coach and each player and their parents signed them. Lindsay thanked the Board for their time.

# **LEGISLATIVE LIASON REPORT**

- Ms. Laird deferred the report to Ms. Garza, who had been invited to a nice forum in which one of the topics for discussion was, the Every Student Succeeds Act which is one of the largest pieces of legislation that they are working on.
- Ms. Garza reported that she was invited by the Ohio Latino Affairs Commission to attend a large workshop. There were a lot of speakers there and she heard some very interesting information. They did discuss the ESSA, but the workshop started out with an FBI agent from Cincinnati, who gave a presentation on gangs and gang activity. He gave them some interesting statistics and information that they can look for to try and prevent these kinds of problems with our kids at school.
- She reported an update on the Mental Health Boards. They discussed how the Hispanic population is underrepresented as far as receiving services. They do not report or realize that there are issues for mental health treatment and initiatives in the Hispanic community.
- The Coroner of Franklin County gave a presentation on how the opioid statistics have increased and believes they will be off the charts for 2017.
- The ESSA representative at the workshop informed them that Ohio submitted the plan to the • Federal Government in September and that they are still waiting hear what they have to say about their plan. The representative also let them know that some states have already heard back. Some states have been criticized for not having enough information to implement the plan and other states are too aggressive and idealistic in their plans and may not be able to do everything that they plan on doing. They are not sure what they will say about Ohio, but Ohio is one of the states that are always right either in relation to the standards or maybe above the standards. One of the things they also discussed was the "N-Size" number for subgroups and that the subgroup count was going to be lowered to 15 but they are arguing about that and it is likely for that number to be set back to 30. For reporting purposes, each state must define the minimum number of students of students "N-Size" required in a subgroup before data can be reported, and apply these definitions consistently across the state for every group of students. The "N-Size" was set at 30 in Ohio so if there are less than 30 students in a subgroup category, the data will not be reported and that is a concern for the subgroup in the community that has less than 30 participants. That subgroup will not be counted and that is a big issue right now so it is likely for that number to be set back to 30. Another issue with ESSA is that they need to understand the plan once the Federal Government accepts it and it is a go. They will have to extend that understanding out to the community and parents so they can understand exactly what it is all about and are able to become active participants in their child's education and follow the guidelines set in the plan.
- Another topic of discussion in the workshop was Human Trafficking.
- There was an overview on Medicaid and the current requirements.
- Ms. Laird mentioned for the parents that may not know that the ESSA is the piece of legislation that really dictates all the testing, methods of teaching and learning, and all of those kinds of things that they have been working through such as the Third Grade Reading Guarantee.

#### Resolution for Executive Session (O.R.C. 121.22)

**WHEREAS**, as a public board of education, the Fremont City School District Board of Education may hold an executive session only after a majority of a quorum (or, in the case of item O, below, a unanimous quorum) of this board determines by a roll call vote to hold such a session and only at a regular or special meeting for the sole purpose of the consideration of any of the following matters:

- A. To consider the appointment of a public employee or official.
- B. To consider the employment of a public employee or official.
- C. To consider the dismissal of a public employee or official.
- D. To consider the discipline of a public employee or official.
- E. To consider the promotion of a public employee or official.
- F. To consider the demotion of a public employee or official.
- G. To consider the compensation of a public employee or official.
- H. To consider the investigation of charges or complaints against a public employee, official, licensee, or student.
- I. To consider the purchase of property for public purposes.
- J. To consider the sale of property at competitive bidding.
- K. To confer with an attorney for the Board concerning disputes involving the Board that are the subject of pending or imminent court action.
- L. To prepare for, conduct, and/or review negotiations or bargaining sessions with public employees concerning their compensation or other terms and conditions of their employment.
- M. To consider matters required to be kept confidential by federal law or regulations or state statutes.
- N. To discuss details relative to the security arrangements and emergency response protocols for the Board.
- O. To discuss confidential information related to an application for economic development assistance, or negotiations with other political subdivisions related to the application, as executive session is necessary to protect interests of the applicant or related expenditure of public funds. (Unanimous vote required.)

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Fremont City School District Board of Education-does hereby declare its intention to hold an executive session on items <u>**B**, **I**</u> as listed above.
