Curriculum Corner

Over the summer while students get a break away from the routine, teachers get busy honing their skills. This summer Fremont teachers participated in many professional development opportunities at the district to help them better utilize their teaching resources. Elementary teachers together with elementary principals attended additional training to learn how our StoryTown reading textbook materials are designed to help students learn to read at their instructional level. This training included how to use each of the many resources available for students who many need more help. Kindergarten teachers spent three days together preparing for our first year of district-wide full day kindergarten. Also, math teachers in grades seven through high school were introduced to their new textbooks and including all the technology components that provide teaching aides.

Students will return this fall to new textbooks for seventh and eighth grade math, Algebra I and Algebra II, Integrated III, Geometry, Pre-calculus and Calculus Elementary students will have new Music books. High school science classes in Physics, Chemistry, Physical Science and Intro to Physics will also receive new textbooks. When new textbooks are selected, teachers spend a great deal of time reviewing a variety of choices. The selection of all our textbooks is based on the standards that our students need to know and be able to do. Teachers also use other criteria to evaluate textbooks such as how the books develop the concepts, at what level of complexity, how assessments are aligned to state texts and how student misconceptions can be overcome during the learning cycle. Our new textbooks come with online student additions that students can access either at home or at the library.

Facility Rentals Available

It is the policy of Fremont City Schools to offer facility rentals for all school owned property. Many groups have used our facilities, for such events as college classes, recognition ceremonies, and community athletic events. The process to rent is as follows:

- For any building rental (classrooms, Little Theater) contact the building principal to complete the Request for Use of School Building form. The building principal must authorize and sign.
- For any athletic facility, contact Mr. Art Bucci, Athletic Director, at Ross High School. Complete the Request for Use of School Building form. Mr. Bucci must authorize and sign.
- All request forms will be forwarded to Dr. Kimberly Theller, Director of Facilities and Operations, for approval.
- A Permit for Use of School Facilities will then be issued detailing all rental and custodial fees.

ALL RENTERS MUST provide a certificate of insurance showing no less than \$500,000 single limit of liability to include premise, operations, products and completed operations.

Costs to renters may vary based on facility, contracted personnel, etc. A copy of the Fremont City Schools Facility Rental Guide may be found on the district website www.fremontschools.net under the facilities link. The Request for Use of School Building form is located under this link and may be printed off for renters to complete. Please submit to respective building principal or Mr. Bucci for signatures.



FMS Project Update

This summer many community members and district personnel have been working diligently on the FMS project. The list below highlights the FMS project work completed during the past three months:

- Fanning-Howey architects met with teachers of grades 6-8 for the purpose of designing their classroom space.
- The FCS Board of Education approved the schematic design for the new middle school at its regularly scheduled meeting on June 15th.
- The Interior Design sub-committee met with Fanning-Howey architects on June 17th for the purpose of selecting flooring, paint colors, and gymnasium design. The district hired Kusmer and Associates, Inc. to complete the surveying services for the FMS project site.
- The following sub-committees were developed and met with Fanning-Howey to discuss specific areas of the new building:
 - Technology sub-committee
 - Plumbing sub-committee
 - Kitchen Design sub-committee 0
 - Mechanical sub-committee
 - Electrical sub-committee
- An environmental site assessment and additional soil borings were completed on the new FMS site.
- Traffic Engineering Services, Inc. was hired to complete a comprehensive traffic study for the entire North Street complex (Ross High School, new FMS, Transportation complex, athletic sites, etc.)
- The district interviewed Maintenance Plan Advisors on July 17th and the Board of Education will act upon the hiring of a firm at the August 20th Board of Education meeting. Hiring of a Maintenance Plan Advisor is required by the Ohio School Facilities Commission.
