Fremont City Schools works collaboratively with the Help Me Grow program, which assists families with the early identification and services for children under the age of three.

We also have a collaborative agreement with the Sandusky County Board of Developmental Disabilities for early childhood and school-age programs provided through the School of Hope.

Together, we will work to find the right services for each child.



Child Find

WHAT IS CHILD FIND?

Child find is the process of locating and evaluating children with suspected disabilities who may be in need of special education and related services. Parents may not be aware that there are programs and services available to them.

Federal, State, and Local regulations require all Ohio schools to conduct annual child find activities.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF CHILD FIND?

- \Rightarrow To promote public awareness of disabilities
- \Rightarrow To alert parents and professionals, to children who may have special needs
- \Rightarrow To assist school districts in finding children who may have disabilities and who otherwise may not have come to their attention
- \Rightarrow To enable children and families to receive the special education and related services that are needed

Child Find

WHO CAN HELP?

Parents, relatives, public and private agency employees and concerned citizens are used to help school districts find any child, ages 3 through 21, who may have a disability and need special education and related services.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Fremont City School personnel will contact the parent/guardian to find out if the child needs to be evaluated for a suspected disability. Free testing is available to families to determine whether or not a disability exists. If a disability needs is identified, the child can begin receiving the appropriate special education and related services.
