#### **Instructional Grants**

It is the mission of The Learning and Liberty Foundation of Fremont City Schools to enhance the learning process, increase educational opportunities and encourage instructional innovation and creativity by generating and distributing financial and other resources. The objectives of The Learning and Liberty Foundation are:

- I. To enhance educational programs and classroom instruction in the Fremont City Schools. Grant proposals will be reviewed by the foundation's board of trustees within the stated purposes of the foundation.
- II. To provide opportunities for organizations, businesses, foundations and individuals to contribute time, energy, expertise, money and other resources to The Learning and Liberty Foundation of the Fremont City Schools.
- III. To invest and manage a permanent fund (for use of interest only) which will be of increasing value to the Fremont City Schools. This fund will provide enduring resources for the proposed programs, ideas and school projects designed to benefit the Fremont City Schools.

#### **Grant Information:**

Fremont City Schools teachers are encouraged to submit proposals for Phase I Instructional Grants, Phase II Mini-Grants and Phase III Music Grants that align to the Foundation's Mission Statement.

Phase I Instructional Grants are available to teachers for up to \$500.00. These grants are intended to enhance the learning opportunities in the classroom by providing resources for the creative teacher for a long-term project or special learning activity.

Phase II Mini-Grants of \$50.00 are available to staff to meet unexpected expenses needed to give impetus to or culminate a creative lesson or class project. That "little extra" is provided to help make a good lesson even more meaningful to students.

Phase III Anthony Schwochow Music Grants of \$150 or more are available to staff who would like to implement a creative music project within the classroom. This classroom project exceeds the regular music curriculum being taught in the classroom.
