The ParentSquare app is available in both the App Store for iOS and the Google Play Store for Android. Downloading the mobile app is the easiest way to receive all school communications.






TEAM OU LEARNS LIFE SKILLS!! Students in Team OU's ELA classes recently studied email etiquette. Students learned the parts of an


