What are your job duties? : As a designer, I create the set for a play. As a properties artisan, I am part of a team that makes or purchases props and furniture that the actors use during the show. I also decorate the set with the scenic designer and director's artistic vision.

What is your favorite and least favorite part about your job? My favorite part is that I am doing something different everyday, from shopping to upholstering or painting. I also love the collaboration between artists to create a unique audience experience. My least favorite part is cleaning up the shop after we have closed a show and have to put it all away.

Compassion is the word of the month for December. Having compassionate and thoughtful students creates a compassionate classroom that will enhance the learning environment. Since younger children are developmentally focused on themselves, it is important that empathy and compassion are taught and modeled at school and home.

Ways to Raise a Compassionate Child

- Teach and model empathy (putting yourself in someone else's shoes and understanding how someone else might feel).
- Donate your time or things you don't use and include your child.
i.e. rake an elderly neighbor's leaves or have your child donate some old toys
- Teaching your child ways to treat things with care helps them develop the understanding that actions have consequences.
- Speak softly. Your kindness will be a role model for how to treat others.
- Acknowledge and listen to others who are talking.
- Teach your child to share, take turns, and be a good sport.
- Use manners like please, thank you and excuse me regularly.
- Treat others with respect. Kids practice what is modeled.
- Compromise and solve problems peacefully.
- Provide structure. It might seem that if you want to raise a compassionate, caring child, you just have to be a compassionate, caring parent.
